Do you need a medical examination as part of your visa requirements? Are you a student, a visitor or a worker with tight deadline? Book an appointment for your examination by phone, email or in person and process your medical examination at IOM Migration Health Assessment Centres (MHAC) in Abuja and Lagos. Your medical results will be sent electronically via eMedical.

### 2. Payment of medical examination fee

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Payment can be made through bank deposit in any Standard Chartered Bank branch in Nigeria or through bank transfer.

You will be requested to present proof of payment (Deposit Slip or Transfer Receipt) when reporting for medical examination. The service fee depends on the medical certificate applicant would like to complete. The all-inclusive medical examination fee is as follows:

*Additional fees and charges may apply if the doctor requests further tests, procedures or examination.*

### 3. What to expect on the day of medical examination

#### What to bring to the medical examination:

- a) Valid Identification documents which include:
  - Original passport
  - Alternative identity documents: Certificate of identity and Refugee travel document.
- b) Two passport size photos.
- c) Proof of payment (Deposit Slip or Transfer Receipt).
- d) Previous Chest X-rays, if available
- e) Information about any prescription medication that you take currently.
- f) Copies of medical reports about any current or previous medical condition(s). Insufficient information may lead to delays and additional testing.
- g) Prescription eyeglasses or contact lenses if you use them to avoid referral to the ophthalmologist.



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**Note:** Children under 16 years must be accompanied by a parent or a legal guardian, who can sign and make decisions on their behalf. Friends and family members without an appointment for medical examination are not permitted to accompany you (visa applicant) during your examination.

### **Advice regarding medical examination**

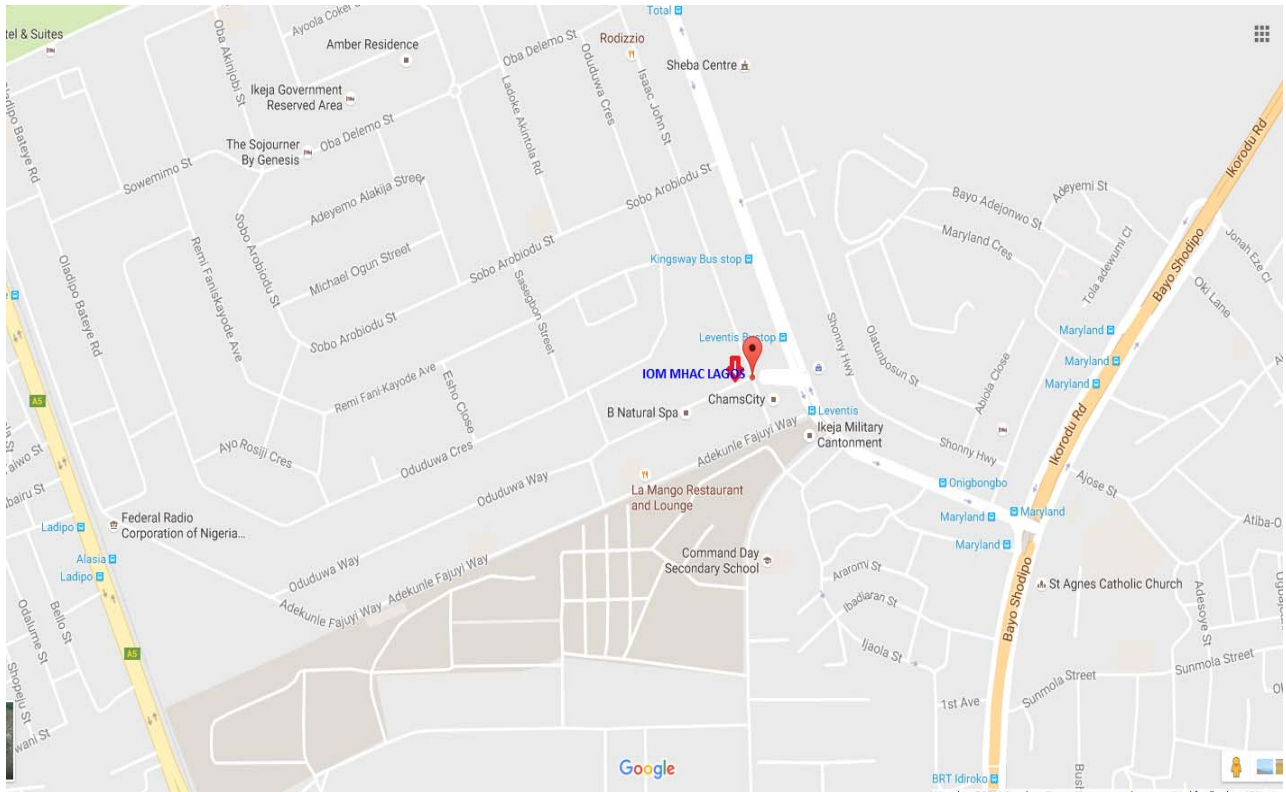
- a) For your medical examination, you will be asked to take off all your clothes except your underwear and bra (for women).
- b) You may require a chaperon to be present during your physical examination, especially if you are to be examined by a physician of the opposite sex.
- c) Do not conceal medical conditions. Deliberate attempts to hide them will be documented in the medical report.
- d) Do not conceal pregnancy. X-ray radiations may harm your unborn baby.
- e) Women are advised to avoid medical exam during menstruation as it may affect results of the urine test.
- f) Postpone or re-schedule your appointment if you or your child is ill with fever.
- g) Your medical examination will take place over a one-day period. Please allow approximately 3 hours for your examination to be completed.
